## George Mardikian

GEORGE MARDIKIAN, our distinguished guest, was born in Xanta, near Papert, Upper Armenia, but at an early age was taken to Tiflis, Georgia, and thence to Scutari, near Istanbul, by his parents, Magar and Haiganoush (Amirian) Mardikian. Shortly after the outbreak of the Turkish Massacres of 1915, Mardikian, then but 15 years of age, made his way to the Caucaian front, where, at Kars, he joined the volunteer Armenian army of liberation and as such participated in the stirring events that wrought the Independent Republic of Armenia.

Mardikian was serving as a scout master under American relief auspicies in 1921 when the Red Army entered American and destroyed that free republic. He subsequently was able to repart the tyrannized country, made his way to the United States and, finally, at San Francisco, established a small business which today has flowered into one of America's most famous restaurants, the Omar Khayyam's.

His success, rather than divoccing him from his parent people, offered him the manifest opportunity to practice his deep love for Armenia and Armenians. Mr. Marchkian's many philantrophies are too well known here to recount.

In a career studded with recurring instances of his interest in the welfare of his computriots, Mr. Mardikian's role in the formation and activities of the American National Committee for homeless Armenians is especially notable.

Early in 1946, Mr. Mardikian, while serving as a special food consultant for the U. S. Army, quite by chance fell in with a large group of Armenian displaced people who were at the moment helpleoly biding their time in a camp near Stuttgast, assaiting the blow of fate. These people had been taken into central Europe by the German armies, and simply refused to return voluntarily to Communist rule.

Mr. Mardikian returned to the United States, and along with other patriotic Armenian Americans, established ANCHA which, in the course of its work, was able to move about 5,000 Armenians from the camps in Germany and Austria to havens of safety and plenty in the United States and South America. The successful effort to aid these destitute peoples remains one of the more remarkable events in the contemporary story of the Aemenian people.

Mr. Mardikian has often been invited to serve on advisory governmental commissions, and has been awarded the important "Medal of Freedom" for his efforts with the U. S. Army in the European Theater. He also served the armed forces in a like capacity during the Korean conflict.

Mr. Mardikian comes to Whitinsville fresh off a trip to the Middle East where he observed the Armenian communities.

We are honored to have Mr. Mardikian, as well as his wife Nazeli, with us in Whitinsville on this occasion.
